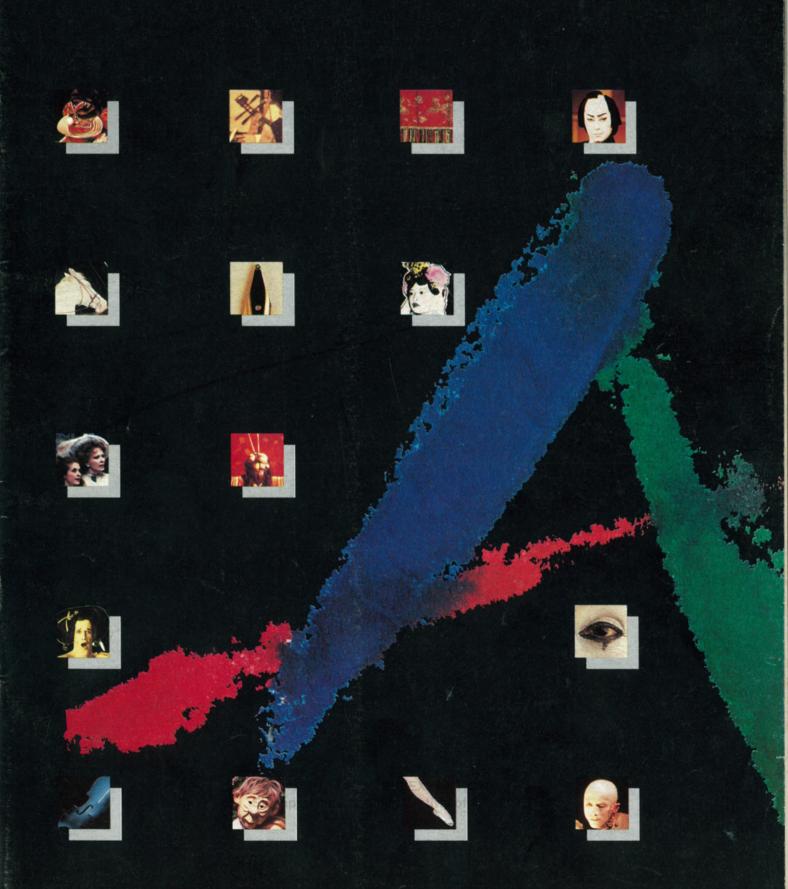

## MESSAGE FROM CHAIRMAN, STEERING COMMITTEE



The Singapore Festival of Arts in June 1990 promises to be a truly exciting one. It will be a month-long Festival with a core programme of 38 productions in 120 performances.

The main programme will be supported by an equally delightful Fringe programme. In all, 300 fringe activities will run concurrently with the main programme to inject a greater festive air. The combined core and fringe events will entertain an estimated target audience of 400,000 in concert halls as well as informal outdoor settings.

The Festival offers a number of blockbusters which will give it artistic as well as popular impact. These highlights include performances by the world-renowned Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, the Houston Symphony Orchestra, the Grand Kabuki, and the China Central Ensemble of National Music.

For the occasion of the 25th Anniversary Celebrations, the Festival has specially commissioned works by local talent: a symphonic work to be played by the SSO; original dance works for the Singapore Dance Theatre; a full evening of chamber work by Singaporean composers; and a new work in Chinese Opera.

The Festival of Arts 1990 is organised with a budget of about \$5.6 million, the biggest so far for the event. A Festival of this scale would not be possible without the generous support of corporate sponsors and donors. Together they have contributed a sum of \$4.3 million. Private sector support is critical in organising the Festival and we would like to thank all our corporate sponsors for their exemplary support.

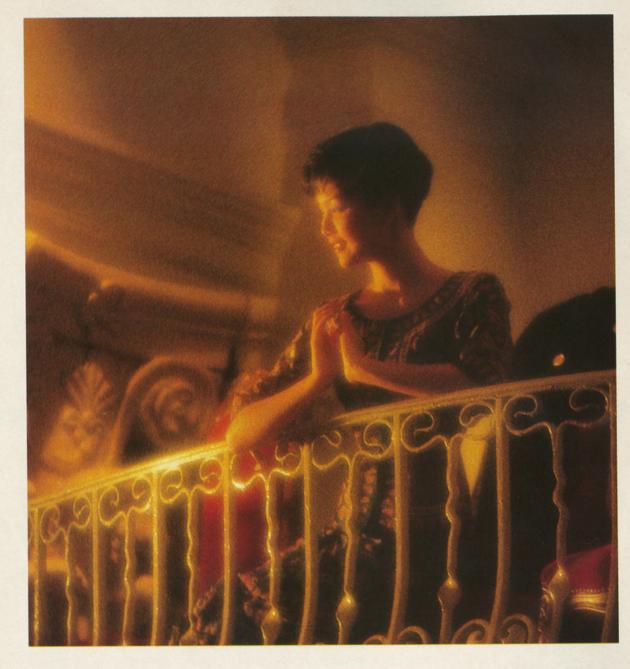
Ultimately, the Festival is for its audience. On behalf of the sponsors and organisers, I invite everyone in Singapore to join us in the Festival.

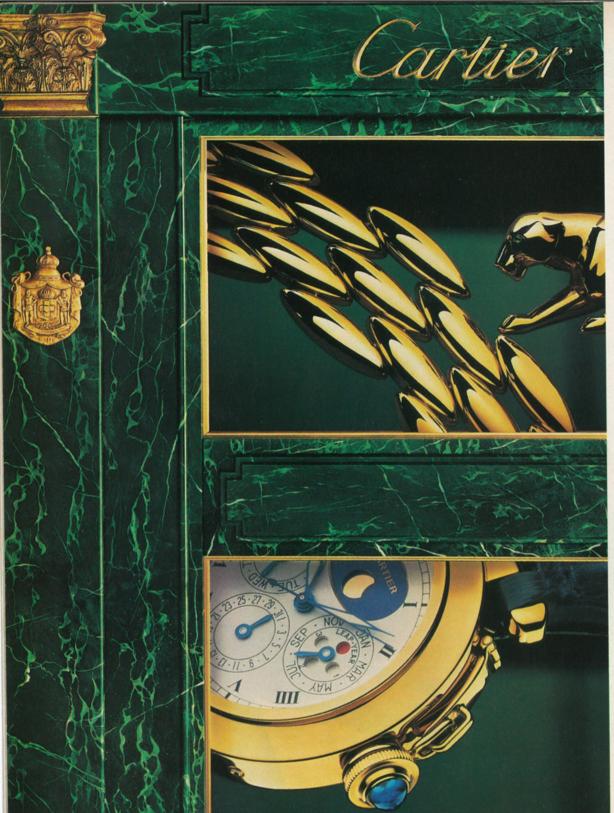

# A Shell Future in Culture.



The Singapore Dance Theatre made its advent as Singapore's first professional ballet company in its debut performance in the Singapore Festival of Arts in June 1988

The exuberance and high standard of professionalism seen in the Company's maiden performance, "Beginnings" sent waves of excitement amongst the local audience while the press gave rave reviews to the young company.

Celebrating its second Anniversary this June, the Singapore Dance Theatre will perform works by four guest choreographers, Christopher Bannerman, Vicente Nebrada, Vassilli Sulich and Gray Veredon, all of whom have been specially invited to work with the dancers of the Singapore Dance Theatre for the Festival.

Christopher Bannerman was born and educated in Toronto, Canada. He won a scholarship to the National Ballet School and graduated into the National Ballet of Canada where he danced with the Company for three years and later joined the London Contemporary Dance School.

Vicente Nebrada is one of today's most sought after choreographers in the international dance scene. Well-known for his neo-classical works, Mr Nebrada has choreographed pieces companies such as the Washington Ballet, the Australian Ballet, Royal Winnipeg Ballet and Ballet Caracas, where he was Artistic Director.

Gary Veredon is well-known for his work with Opera companies such as the Metropolitan Opera, New York. His works have also been featured in major companies internationally.

Vassilli Sulich, Founder/Artistic Director of the Nevada Dance Theatre, was honoured by the State of Nevada as outstanding individual artist in 1981, Mr Vassilli has also won the most outstanding choreographer award in Varna, Bulgaria.

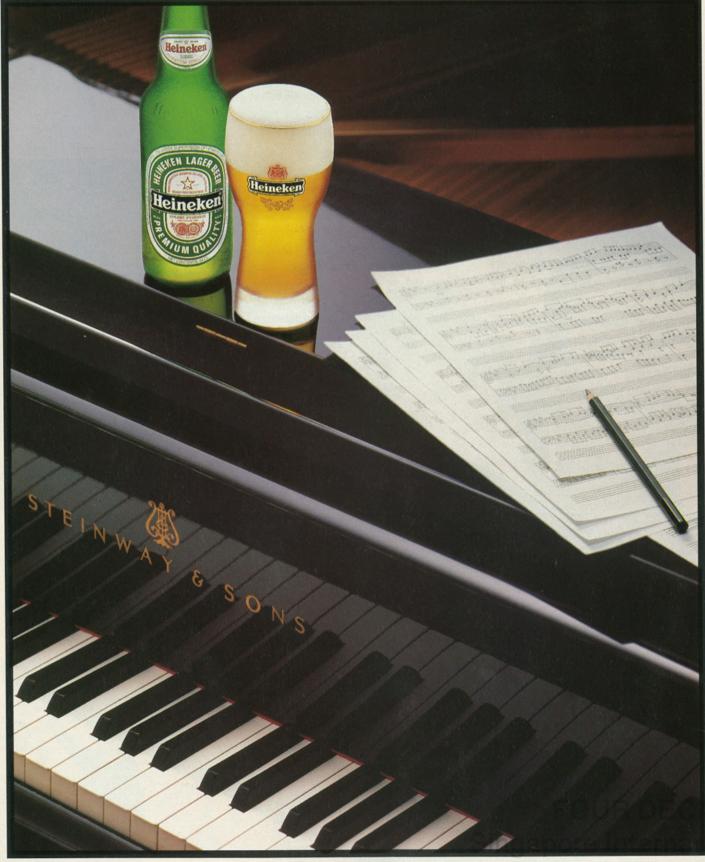

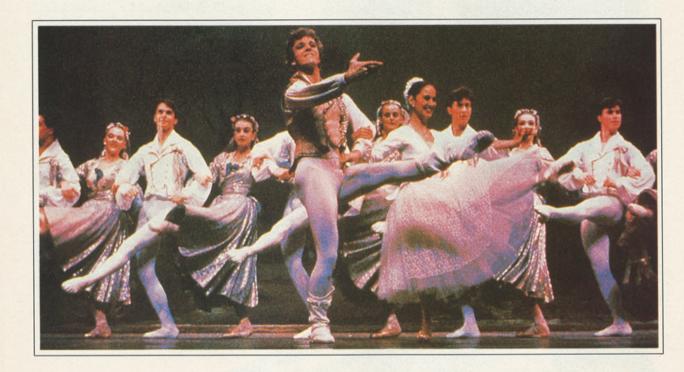

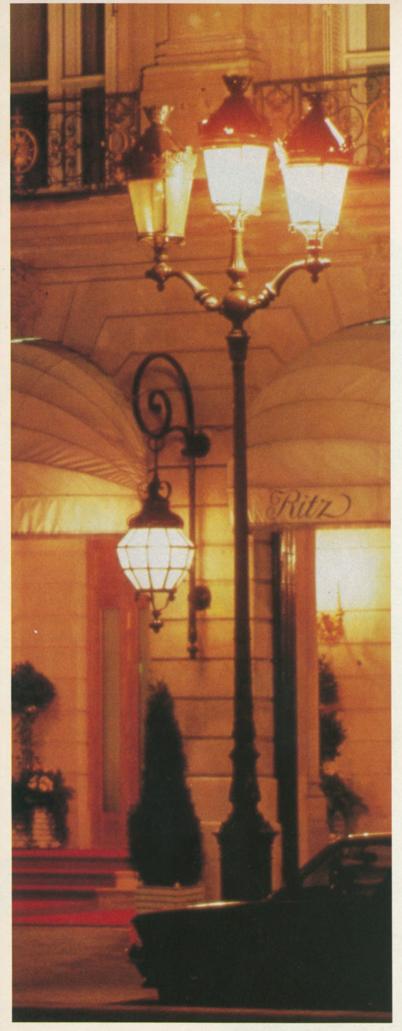

The form originated in the elegant and cultivated town of Soochow as early as the Sung Dynasty (960-1278), when musicians and 'sing-song' girls would entertain patrons after dinner with song and story.

By the Ming Dynasty (1368-1628), this had developed into a sophisticated, highly structured art form. Intricately woven stories told in music and commentary could run on for a year or more, with audiences returning for a different episode in each performance.

The setting is simple: a table and two chairs. In one sits the musician playing his instrument. In the other is the story teller with his fan.

The fan is the only prop used. Open, it can denote a lady who is shy, angry, or arrogant. When closed it can represent a male speaker, a flute, a stick, a brush, or any other implement.

Even to the uninitiated, Shanghai Lyrics are touching. The music is limpid and full of charm. The drama, the tension, and conflict; the tumultous action and turbulent emotions of the narrative are only presented in delicate nuance.

For the aficionado, the genius is in the subtlety.

The Festival programme of Shanghai Lyrics will include excerpt from the classics, The Three Kingdoms, Water Margin and Dream of the Red Chamber, as well as popular opera excerpts and Chinese folk tales and songs, making three evenings of unsurpassed refinement and elegance.

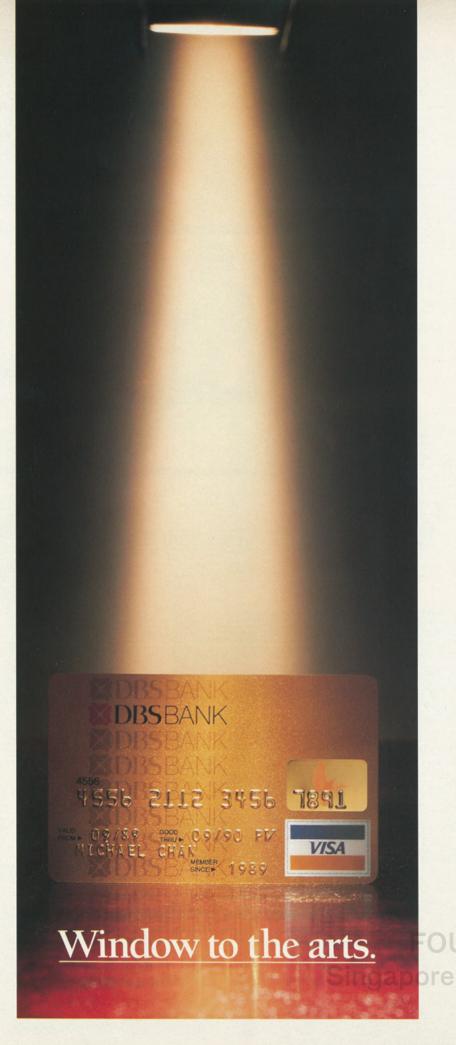

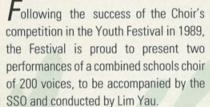

When the play starts, it is Chinese New Year. Her relatives' nagging and unwanted advice force Kah-wei to seek refuge in her room. The scenes that follow reveal the different aspects of her character, and her relationships with those around her in childhood and in adult life.

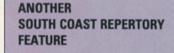
GEORGE BERNARD SHAW

**F** ounded at the end of the sixteenth century, Kabuki dance embodies much of the mystique, ritual and symbolism of Japanese culture.

A feature of Kabuki is the absence of women who were banned from the cast in its early years when authorities concluded that the excessive attention they attracted from male admirers would lead to serious public degradation.

The company will perform two plays. The first, RENJISHI, based on the Chinese legendary tale of the lion parent giving its

child strict training in the rigours of survival — to the extent of pushing it over a cliff. It culminates with the famous Bion Dance. The other, KASANE POSSESSED, a play about an illicit love affair. This work dates from 1873. Life, death, evil deeds and retribution are the themes which dominate this powerful drama.

These contrasting examples of Kabuki provide a fascinating glimpse of an art form which introduced glamour and excitement to theatregoers in Japan nearly 400 years ago and remains vivid to this day.

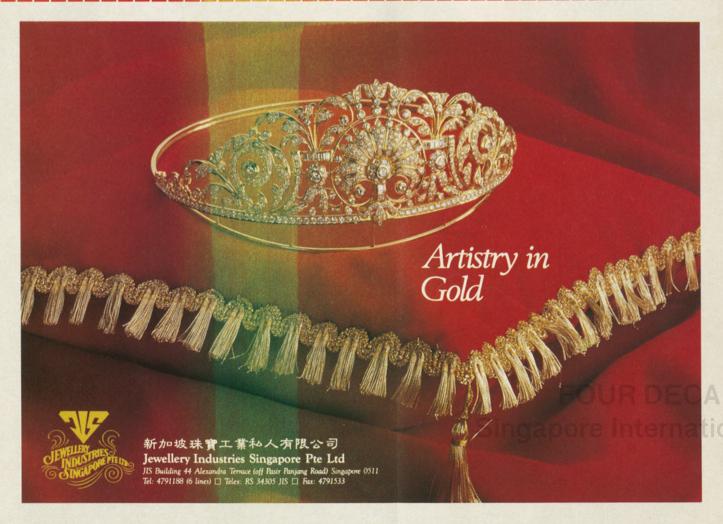

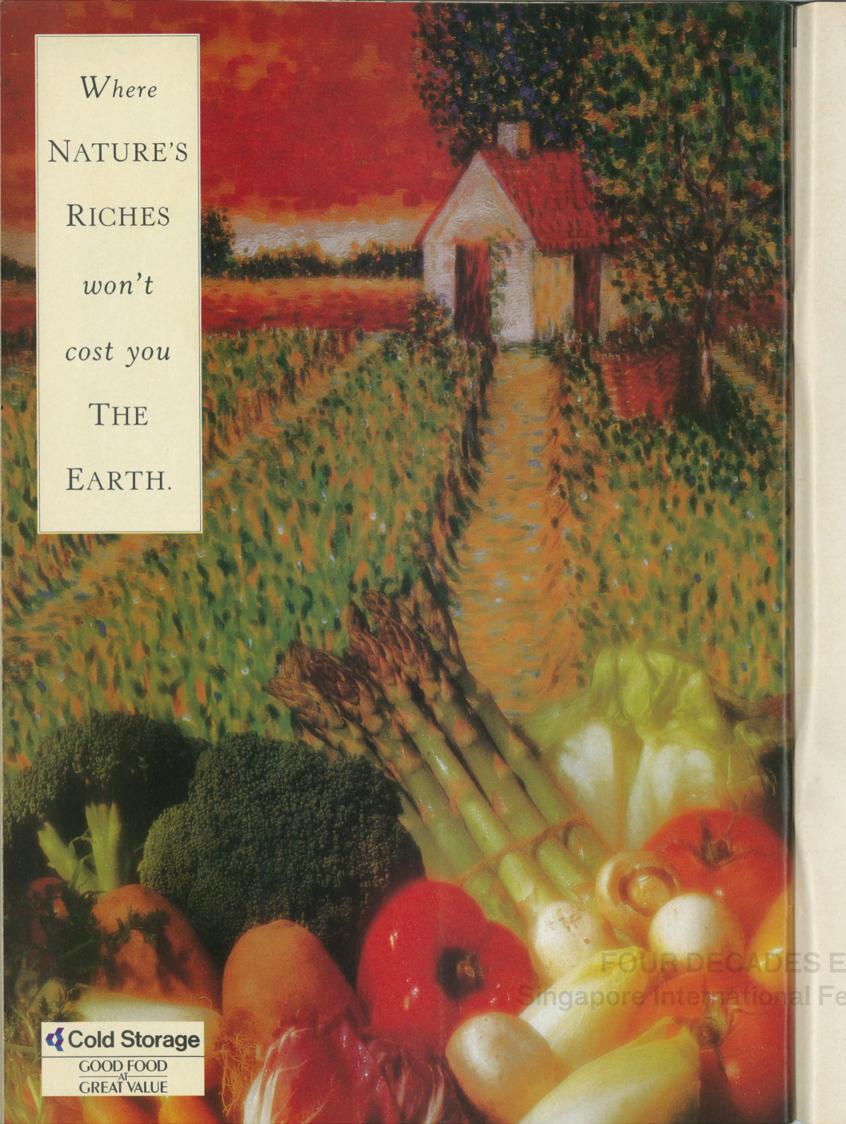
