My colleagues and I at the National Arts Council warmly welcome you to the 10th Singapore Festival of Arts. We are proud to see its growth from a small Festival back in 1977, to a major international arts event.

The Festival aims to entertain the Singapore audience and visitors alike with outstanding performances by Singaporean and international artists. 27 foreign groups and 10 Singaporean groups will stage a total of 115 performances for the core programme. The outreach arm of the Festival, the Festival Fringe, will feature over 200 performances by some 50 Singapore and 32 foreign groups in both indoor and outdoor venues.

The best of Singaporean works will be showcased in the Festival. A specially commissioned Singapore musical, *Kampong Amber*, will kick off the Core programme. The Libretto by musician Dick Lee is based on the script by another Singaporean, writer Catherine Lim. Glen Goei, who took the West End by storm in his role as Song Li-Ling in David Henry Hwang's *M Butterfly*, will return to Singapore under the "Home Coming" Series to take the lead role.

The Vietnam National Puppetry Theatre will amaze us with their water puppets; the Beijing People's Art Theatre, which played to standing ovations when they performed at the 1986 Festival here, returns with two plays - A Farmer's Nirvana and Top Restaurant.

The Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra from the United Kingdom, under the direction of Czechborn conductor, Libor Pešek, will make its debut in Singapore. Three soloists will be featured with the Orchestra: world renowned Russian pianist, Lazar Berman, talented Singaporean violinist, Kam Ning,

and pianist Toh Chee Hung.

The Hubbard Street Dance Chicago from the United States will perform an inventive repertoire of modern dances, blending classical ballet techniques with jazz and modern dance. The Royal Ballet of Flanders from Belgium will perform *Dracula*, a thriller ballet created by the late Stuart Sebastian, and a mixed bill.


Three art exhibitions will be held: a solo exhibition by eminent Taiwanese artist, Chiang Chao-Shen, a major exhibition of Indian decorative Arts and an exhibition of 20th Century Spanish Art and the Third Dimension.

Fringe '94 will offer three weeks of fun-filled entertainment for the family from 22 May to 12 June. Highlights include The Flying Dutchmen, an acrobatic troupe from Holland, Smallest Theatre in the World from the United Kingdom and Singapore's own Ivan Heng's production of *The Woman in a Tree on a Hill,* an award winning show in last year's Edinburgh Festival Fringe. A Festival Parade along Orchard Road, with stilt walkers, acrobats, brass bands and Scottish bagpipers, will kick off the Festival.

Last, but not least, a word of thanks to the sponsors of the Festival. Without their generosity and support , this Festival would not have been possible. Itake great pleasure in welcoming you to the 1994 Singapore Festival of Arts.

ormed in 1979 with only 41 members, the 90-strong Singapore Symphony Orchestra (SSO) is one of the leading orchestras in the region. Under Music Director and Resident Conductor maestro Choo Hoey's guidance, the SSO presents a wide repertoire that spans Baroque to 20th century works by Singapore and other composers. The SSO has made three successful tours to Europe since 1985, and to celebrate its 15th anniversary this year, the Orchestra toured Europe again, making its debut appearance in La Salle Pleyel in Paris, the Bijloke Festival Hall in Ghent, the George Enescu Hall in Bucharest, and participated in a cultural exchange programme in Cairo. For its contribution to the Festival, the Orchestra together with the Singapore Symphony Chorus, will be performing Mahler's Symphony No. 2 under the baton of specially invited conductor,

Gilbert Kaplan, who is known as the conductor of one work only (Mahler's Symphony No. 2). A businessman by profession, Kaplan's first conducting effort of the work in 1982 at New York's Lincoln Centre was so enthusi-

astically received that one critic called it 'one of the five or six most profoundly realized Mahler Seconds I have heard in a quarter century'. Since then, Mr Kaplan has been invited by orchestras around the world to conduct this symphony in acclaimed performances.

Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra

ounded in 1840, the Royal Liverpool Philharmonic Orchestra is one of the oldest orchestras in the world, boasting a lineage of renowned conductors like Max Bruch, Sir Henry Wood, Malcolm Sargent and Charles Groves in its long and distinguished history. The Orchestra's tradition of artistic excellence and innovative programming has been enhanced by their current music-director, Czechborn Libor Pesek. For over 20 years, the Orchestra has successfully toured many European countries, including a triumphant visit to Czechoslovakia in 1988. Under Pesek's baton, the Orchestra undertook its first ever tour to the United States in 1992, which was a resounding success. hen confronted with percussion instruments, the popular tendency is to think of them as just "back-up" instruments, but Nexus aims to change that misconception. Formed in 1971 by Bob Becker, William Cahn, Robin Engelman, Russell Hartenberger and John Wyre, Nexus has come to be recognised as one of the foremost chamber ensembles in the world. It has also been billed as the world's top percussion group. With a wide and eclectic repertoire, their sheer stage presence and technical skill forces one to re-think the conventional boundaries of percussion music. Since 1975, the group has toured extensively in the United States, Europe, and Asia and have also won numerous accolades and awards.

he Trinidad Theatre Workshop's offering for the Singapore Festival of Arts 1994 is *Pantomime*, a fast-paced comedy by 1992 Nobel Prize laureate for Literature, Derek Walcott. *Pantomime* is a reinterpretation of the popular adventure story, Robinson Crusoe. The story revolves around a cast of two main characters: a retired English actor who has bought a hotel in Tobago, and his recalcitrant and witty black handyman. In the hope of entertaining their guests, the Englishman proposes that the two work up a satire on the Robinson Crusoe story.

Apart from the cracking pace and witty dialogue, the play also examines the effects British colonialism had, and continues to have on West Indian society and also emphasises the problematic ideas of hierarchy in human relationships and the question of identity.





stablished in 1985, Theatreworks is Singapore's premier professional theatre company. During its short history, it has produced numerous highly acclaimed productions. azuo Ohno, who was born in 1906, started studying dance in 1933 at the Baku Ishii Dance School, and his dance debut in 1949 was an inspiration to Tatsumi Hijikata, a man with whom he was to collaborate closely in the following decades. Their works were a reaction against an apathetic dance tradition which was irrelevant to post-Hiroshima Japan, and which, expectedly enough, also earned their expulsion from the All Japan Dance Association, because they defied the rules of conventional dance to present images of shattered humanity: of diseased, mutilated, violent and sexually repressed people. Butoh eschews traditional technique for an art drawn from raw inner experience and expressed with intense inwardness. Kazuo Ohno has been called the father of butoh, because he was one of the earliest practitioners of that 20th century theatre dance form. For the Singapore Festival of Arts 1994, Kazuo Ohno will be collaborating with his son, Yoshito Ohno, to present two productions: *Dead Sea* (1985), which explores the bewilderment of the dead searching for love and *Water Lilies* (1987), inspired by Monet's series of paintings of the same name.

The esteemed poet, painter and art historian, has forged an important new path for the development of literati painting in the modern era. 



Although Indian art is ancient and predominently religious, it also revels in ornamentation for its own sake. With renewed attention being focused on Indian culture, this exhibition represents a timely and valuable opportunity for Singaporeans and visitors alike to view a genuinely comprehensive range of Indian artifacts.


