

Station House Opera's *Play on Earth* literally crosses time and space in the Festival's first-ever simultaneous transcontinental world premiere in Singapore, São Paulo and NewcastleGateshead. New works by Singapore's TheatreWorks, The Necessary Stage and Drama Box look into intimate worlds beyond stereotypical myths and images.

Crossing musical boundaries bring new sonic ideas and languages – whether in the form of vegetables (!) or in cross-cultural ensembles inspired by the musical cultures of Africa, Middle East, and Asia. The finest of classical music presented in the Festival is also not complete without a special celebration of Mozart's 250th anniversary with the Camerata Salzburg.

Don't miss this year's expanded visual arts programme as well as the outreach programme which offer many free activities that will entice and entertain everyone of all ages.

There is certainly much to see and do during the three and a half weeks of the Festival. My team and I wish you an enjoyable time!

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




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

QUEST

Singapore Dance Theatre & Singapore Chinese Orchestra WORLD PREMIERE

An all-Asian creation of remarkable scale, commanding the region's special talents in dance and music!

Inspired by the music of three composers, three choreographers come together to create a triple-bill evening of contemporary dance, drawing on Asian aesthetics to express man's struggle for release and freedom.

Korea's Kim Eun Hee, choreographer and artistic director of Kim Eun Hee Company, reflects on human will through breath and movement in the Path, the Illusion, with music from Fire Ritual, the huqin concerto by Tan Dun.

China's Gao Yan Jin Zi, resident artist of Beijing Modern Contemporary Dance, depicts the cycle of life based on the five elements of gold, wood, water, fire, and earth in her work INTO, accompanied by composer Chan Hing Yan's composition Illusion.

Singapore's Jeffrey Tan, resident choreographer of Singapore Dance Theatre, portrays in F.U.S.E. the intimacy between man and nature through ritual folk songs re-worked by composer Tang Jian Ping in Hou Tu.

Under the baton of music director Yeh Tsung, the Singapore Chinese Orchestra has won admiration for its success in bold collaboration with contemporary artists of different fields. In this unprecedented collaboration between dance and Chinese music, the trademark edge of the superb Singapore Chinese Orchestra is, as always, unmistakable.

GEISHA

TheatreWorks (Singapore) ASIAN PREMIERE

Sea of remembrance:
"How cruel the floating world
Its solaces how few And soon my unmourned life
Will vanish with the dew"

The Geisha is perhaps one of the biggest symbols of Japanoiserie, it is an empty screen on which all our fantasies of Japan can be projected, even for many contemporary Japanese individuals today who do not come into contact easily with this old world. However it is not just exotic but it is a powerful arena to discuss the water world or a dream world, a floating world. It seems to encapsulate many notions of Japanese identity, gender relationships but more universally it is a space to discuss life, dream and reality for the world.

Conceived and directed by Ong Keng Sen, Geisha involves New York-based performer Karen Kandel (winner of several Obies), who weaves together stories from geishas, maikos (apprentice geishas), clients, their wives, okamisans (mama-sans), offspring of geishas, and anthropologists. Joining her onstage will be kabuki dancer Gojo Masanosuke in the female onnagata role drawing from the age-old repertory of kabuki and nihon buyoh (classical Japanese dance).

From the famed traditional school of shamisen, Kineya Katsumatsu joins forces with electronic wizard Toru Yamanaka who created the contemporary soundscapes for the seminal shows of Dumb Type and fashion designer Mitsushi Yanaihara who juxtaposed distilled clothes with a visual treat of kabuki ornate costumes. As the geisha spins her world through the art of stories, dance and music in the ochaya (tea house), the enriching dialogue between the traditional and contemporary continues in Geisha...

SHANGHAI BEAUTY

Jin Xing Dance Theatre (China)

Beauty is in the eyes of the beholder...

This is the starting point of the collaboration in Shanghai Beauty between Jin Xing Dance Theatre and Rubato Dance Company from Germany.

What are the different social and cultural views towards beauty and the human body in Shanghai, a modern metropolis of over 16 million people with a long and chequered history?

Themes of new versus old, individuality versus conformity, and east versus west, take on vivid images in *Shanghai Beauty*. At one point, 16 dancers turn Mao jackets inside out to reveal bright lining with loud flower prints, and then remove trousers to flaunt glittering gowns.

From her disciplined origins in the cultural troupe of the People's Liberation Army to the glamour chic of modern Shanghai, Jin Xing jointly creates with Dieter Baumann and Jutta Hell, choreographers of Rubato Dance Company, a truly polished reflection on beauty and difference, performed by members of her own company.

BELLA FIGURA

Nederlands Dans Theater I (The Netherlands)


The world-beloved Nederlands Dans Theater I (NDT I) finally arrives in Singapore!

The powerhouse troupe will present a triple-bill shared by three most eminent choreographers from Europe in a sumptuous night of balletic finesse.

Appointed artistic director at age 28 and now house choreographer of NDT I, Jiří Kylián has catapulted NDT I into the dance world and sustained its pre-eminence for the last 30 years.

In Bella Figura, exploring what it feels to be standing on the edge of a dream, the visionary Kylián sends his dancers skimming across a white stage. In one scene, vivid images of semi-nude torsos of dancers in lush and long red skirts sharpen the tenuous moments of dream fusing with reality.

NDT I's resident choreographers duo, Lightfoot Léon (Paul Lightfoot and Sol Léon) also play with space and perception. In Safe as Houses, a sliding wall provides visual hide-and-seek, and the climax is nothing less than an exhilarating pas de deux and ensemble work.


Compagnie Marie Chouinard (Canada)

Marie Chouinard's debut at the Singapore Arts Festival 2002 was stunning for its dance vocabulary: primal yet geometrical. She now returns with new perceptions of the human anatomy and motion.

In her latest work, Bach's Goldberg Variations has been "transformed, decomposed, recomposed and remixed" into an intriguing sonic scape.

Using devices such as ropes, horizontal bars and harnesses - 10 dancers create architectural forms and new gestural dynamics to execute variations on the exercise of freedom. Sometimes they look fettered, at other times they physically expand, giving rise to a work that is a spectacle of both calculated distortion and beguiling beauty.

An aesthete beyond norms, Marie Chouinard remixes movement and music to create a work that is sumptuous and wild, plumbing the insoluble mystery of the body, of the living being.



DROUGHT AND RAIN - TWO MEMORIES, TWO GENERATIONS

Ea Sola with elderly village women from the North Delta of Vietnam, Vietnam National Opera Ballet - Hanoi and an ensemble of traditional singers and musicians (Vietnam/France) ASIAN PREMIERE

For Ea Sola, the questions of memory, modernity and responsibility never end. With the eye of a poet, the Franco-Vietnamese choreographer dissects the psyche of war-gashed Vietnam. She then wed traditional music and gestures to express the epic loss and longing of her people. In 2001, Ea Sola was a festival highlight with her swansong *Requiem*, an emotional tour de force. After a five-year absence, Ea Sola returns to stage to re-question the memory of war, the subject of her first creation with *Drought and Rain* in 1995. Working then with old Vietnamese villagers, the work took the world stage by storm.

In her 2005 creation *Drought and Rain Vol. 2*, Ea Sola asks: what do the minds and bodies of contemporary youth in fast-changing Vietnam remember today? With dancers from the Vietnam National Opera Ballet - Hanoi, she illuminates a different viewpoint, a contemporary aesthetic, and a new kinetic generation. The result is startlingly direct and heartfelt choreography, refreshing and real.

In this Festival special, we bring not just her latest work of *Drought and Rain Vol. 2*, but also juxtapose it with her earlier work in a new re-creation of *Drought and Rain* in 2006, to create one single unforgettable journey - one world, two generations, two memories, ten years apart.

FORWARD MOVES

Aaron Khek/Kuik Swee Boon/Danny Tan/Elysa Wendi (Singapore) YORLD PREMIERE

In a new dance creation platform, four Singapore dance makers stage their choreographic debut in the Festival, each distilling their choreographic essence in miniature dancescapes, each exploring the borders of hope and tenderness, capturing aspects of life that are complex yet heartfelt.

Aaron Khek (2005 Young Artist Award recipient) of Ah Hock and Peng Yu explores the interplay of dream and illusion in a rhapsodic solo work Standing in the Middle of Our See-Saw with music by Arvo Pärt and Steve Reich.

Inspired by the theme of migration, Kuik Swee Boon formerly of Singapore Dance Theatre and now a principal dancer of Nacho Duato's Compănía Nacional de Danza delves into human restlessness and the search for home and belonging in *Never Land*.

Danny Tan (2004 Young Artist Award recipient), founder and artistic director of Odyssey Dance Theatre, presents his solo debut at the Singapore Arts Festival in his personal capacity as a performer. He traces his roots in *Providence* through the vocals of Teochew opera, bridging the Chinese tradition with contemporary sensibility.

Fashioning dance out of everyday actions, Elysa Wendi of ARTS FISSION reaches for the ephemeral beauty of a seemingly mundane life in Für Steffi, pour Olivier.

THE WALL

Al Kasaba Theatre & Cinematheque (The Palestinian Territories)



This is story-telling theatre at its gem best: simple, direct and personal.

A professional theatre company based in Ramallah, Al Kasaba Theatre & Cinematheque unfolds the stories of ordinary folks living behind the wall that divides Israel and the Palestinian territories on the West Bank of the Jordan River.

With a minimal but dynamic set of panels, the actors sing, dance and narrate hard facts and funny truths about separation and segregation.

Hamlet's "To be or not to be" speech is recited by a corpse who is not entitled to a proper funeral as his will decrees he be buried in another cemetery on the other side of the wall.

A human story rather than a political story, The Wall is by turns playful, poignant and painful.

The Necessary Stage (Singapore) WORLD PREMIERE

We don't think twice about the abundance of foreign workers in our midst – the silent Indonesian man cleaning our void deck, the Filipina maid raising our child, the Thai worker constructing our roads... But what are the stories behind these anonymous people? What families have they left behind? What legal and illegal obstacles have they overcome? Do they even have a name?

Directed by Alvin Tan and Tatsuo Kaneshita with Haresh Sharma as head writer, Mobile is a unique collaboration involving artists from Singapore, Thailand, Philippines and Japan, dealing with stories of women and men who are affected by movement and migration. As the world becomes more mobile, has it also become more foreign?

A STRANGER AT HOME

Drama Box (Singapore) WORLD PREMIERE

"Where do you want to die?"
"In someone's arms."

A professor and his students embark on the study of life through e-mail exchanges. What does the heart want and where is it located? Will home be found there?

Meet life's characters – the teacher, the lover, the old woman, the medium and the terrorist who lay bare their hearts even as they search for it. Each is at the crossroad of choice: to claim a new sense of belonging or be lost to nostalgia.

Adapted and directed by Young Artist Award recipient Kok Heng Leun and presented with film by award-winning film maker Royston Tan in a combination of theatre, music, film and words, *A Stranger at Home* is a visceral look at the impact of the changing urban landscape on human emotions, needs, memories and existence.

DEATH AND | SITI Company (USA) THE PLOUGHMAN ASIAN PREMIERE

Directed by the charismatic Anne Bogart, the SITI Company breathes contemporary vitality into the 600-year-old script, Death and the Ploughman.

Written by Johannes von Saaz in the early Renaissance era, and now adapted from German into English by the remarkable Irish writer Michael West, we join a grief-stricken farmer as he treks the labyrinth of his soul, arguing with Death over the return of his deceased young wife. In the crisis of faith that ensues, the play accosts hierarchy, authority and the value of life.

Physically and vocally dexterous, the 3-member cast moves in taut ease on a monochrome abstraction of a chess board, delivering bristling dialogue with cathartic depth.

A leading American ensemble, the SITI Company's trademark actor-training combines the vigilant Suzuki method and Viewpoints improvisation.

PHOBIA | Chamber Made Opera (Australia)



A film thriller for the stage inspired by Hitchcock's Vertigo, but with an added twist. In Phobia, the audience is transported back to a radio studio, where the sound track for an imagined film - every word, every sound, and every bit of music heard - is produced by studio performers.

On a big cluttered desk, every prop is used ingeniously for hand-made sound effects. Windscreen wipers, egg-beaters, ice in glass, or crunching celery conjures an atmosphere of suspense and intrigue - the squeaking door, the distant scream, the clacking heels, the ringing telephone - as you meet the femme fatale, husband, and detective in an archetypal story of love, obsession and deception.

Phobia inhabits an enigmatic world of film noir celebrating the multi-tasking skills of Foley artists, sound-effects artists (after Hollywood sound artist Jack Foley) commonly employed in 1950s and 1960s film-making. The theatricality, musicality, irony and humour of the work is inextricably bound with the absurdities and intricacies involved in producing their sound world.

PLAY ON EARTH

Station House Opera (UK) in collaboration with TheatreWorks (Singapore), Philarmonia Brasileira (Brazil) and NewcastleGateshead Initiative (UK) WORLD PREMIERE


Dusk in Singapore, tea time in Britain, breakfast in Brazil.

Nine people from three continents perform in one single production.

A quayside building in NewcastleGateshead, a skyscraper in São Paulo and a riverside theatre in Singapore merge to become a fourth imaginary space.

> Three audiences, one in each city, watch the performance simultaneously.

The transcontinental world premiere of Station House Opera's major new work Play on Earth opens across the globe in June, a work that in every literal sense transcends time and space. This first time, three-continent work is a collaboration between Station House Opera (UK), TheatreWorks (Singapore) and Philarmonia Brasileira (Brazil).



In São Paulo, Newcastle and Singapore, audiences arrive at a building to watch a show, all visible to each other as they take their seats. This global audience then discovers a much larger, fourth performance, visible on three screens above the actors. Projected simultaneously from three corners of the world, a narrative unfolds, immediate, unpredictable and alive.

A Brazilian couple is eating breakfast, but the woman is very interested in the man sleeping in Singapore; and why is the English woman watching so closely? When he leaves his flat, she follows him through the streets of Newcastle to his rendezvous in São Paulo. The revelation of their relationships is played out across the globe - by performers in three continents together telling a story which is both universal and true to its own locality, its own culture and concerns.

What are our relations to the rest of the world?

Are we strangers or are we family?

Station House Opera's work in combining filmed and live performance takes a further step in *Play on Earth*, pushing the interface of filmed and simultaneous performance to the global level, showing concurrently across three continents and time zones. In the Singapore segment, Jeffery Tan directs a Singapore cast who are among the global citizens inhabiting both a familiar and unfamiliar global world.

Play on Earth is a major international collaboration between Singapore Arts Festival,
Station House Opera, NewcastleGateshead Initiative, Northern Stage, Artsadmin,
TheatreWorks and Philarmonia Brasileira. Play on Earth is also performed as part of the
World Summit on Arts & Culture in NewcastleGateshead with support from the auspices of the
Arts Council England - National Arts Council Singapore Cultural Cooperation Programme.

Schauspielhaus Vienna (Austria) ASIAN PREMIERE

Small lives, big dreams. A bitter-sweet reality. This universal human condition is captured in the wonderful plays by dramatist Anton Chekov. In Samovar, you are invited, like in a traditional Russian tea-gathering, to come up close and observe the dark human comedies and irony of the common man.

Using live-cartooning and drawing, the main characters of *The Three Sisters, The Cherry Orchard, Uncle Vanya* and *The Seagull* are penciled and come alive before our eyes.

Through camera projection, they move through the rooms of a miniature model of a Russian country home that provides the three-dimensional background for the lively figures.

With this unique 'live animation' and narration of the original texts, Samovar is a piece of fascinating handmade imagery that creates both a touching and estranging world of poetic animation.

Infused with whiffs of nostalgia, caricature, longing, empathy and irony, we are drawn as voyeurs into a world of Slavic charm and their comic tragedies that we sense are our own.


