A very warm welcome to the Singapore Arts Festival 2012!

Over 16 extraordinary days, we invite you to encounter a stunning array of performances that we hope will be close to your heart.

The Singapore Arts Festival 2012 completes the trilogy we started two editions ago: Between You and Me (2010), I Want to Remember [2011]. Our Lost Poems [2012].

Our Lost Poems will look at myths, legends, wandering thoughts, reflections, lost riddles and hidden stories. It is a discovery of tales and aspirations that need to be told and retold. Stories that inspire us, legends that have deep cultural roots and riddles that reveal the secrets of the world. This coming festival finds us at a crossroad, waiting to reaffirm our sense of place in time as we uncover refreshing facets of ourselves:

Something ancient. Something lost. Something hidden. Something new.

The 2012 Festival will also highlight the presence of puppetry. This is one of the most important mediums in the region, through which stories, legends, teachings, folklore and myths are communicated, and passed on, to generations to come.

This will begin in April with World of Stories, a special exhibitionperformance featuring the work of students across 12 regional libraries. With this programme,

Our Kids Arts Village returns for a second edition anchored by a very unique architectural performance installation called Tangle where we invite kids young and old to get involved to build up the space.

The Festival Village also makes its sophomore appearance, this time featuring all free programmes and activities. From jazz, blues to hip hop, dikir barat (a musical form native to the Malay Peninsula) to an all-girl deejay bootcamp, film screenings to even a centaur appearance - be prepared to be

Alas, even a fortress gives way after relentless assault. Before long, the jade bird uncovers a sly plot to turn his palace into a theme


A young boy arrives to learn about the authentic past from him.

THE MASTERMIND BEHIND THE FLIGHT OF THE JADE BIRD IS...

...homegrown composer, producer, singer and musician Mark Chan, who has proven his multifaceted talents, composing music for more than 30 plays and releasing seven solo albums, all of which show off his capable blend of Eastern and Western artistry.

Chan has been busy the past several years with major projects. Opiume, a modern chamber opera inspired by the illicit opium trafficking in 19th-century China, made it as the main programme at both the Singapore Arts Festival 2004 and Hong Kong New Vision Arts Festival 2004.

In 2007, Dreaming of Kuanyin, Meeting Madonna premiered at the

Singapore Arts Festival. That same year, Little Toys, co-commissioned in 2003 by the Hong Kong Arts Festival and Singapore Arts Festival, featured at the Shanghai International Arts Festival.

Little Toys, a 1933 Chinese silent film starring movie icon Ruan Lingyu set in 21st-century Shanghai, was a phenomenal success. It left a mark in Singapore, Hong Kong, Copenhagen, Shanghai and Paris.

Five years on, The Flight of the Jade Bird, woven together by his passion for jade and love for culture, is yet another reminder of Chan's mastery.

This time he goes for broke - conceptualising, writing, composing and directing.

Ming, Oscar, Robert and Daniel are entangled in a web of passion. They love and hate one another but Robin Loon, who was in the 2006 they invariably come back to the place where they first started - a place of love and understanding.

The four characters battle their own demons while struggling to free one another from their ghosts.

In the process, they find new meaning in the words they use, and ultimately, create a language of their own.

A Language of Their Own debuted in New York in 1995, and made it to the Singapore stage 11 years later.

It caught the attention of Singapore theatre academic audience. Together with director Casey Lim, Loon decided to translate the piece into Chinese for the Singapore Arts Festival 2011 OPEN-STUDIO platform.

With the 2012 staging, you can expect Loon's memory as an audience member to retain an 1 0 02 significant semblance of the old while Lim's interpretation will ferry in a strong dash of the new.

Casev Lim. the director, who worked closely with Loon to transform Chay's memorable work into Chinese through a six-month process that included three readings of the Chinese text - first of the text literary, then of the text as performance text, and finally the text as memory text.

Hotels, factories and rooftops these are places you have heard of, or are familiar with, but barely take notice of. After all, they are just...there.

Ciudades Paralelas (Parallel Cities) offers you the chance to be a participant, an observer, a provocateur or an intruder, to engage in another perspective of these spaces as they transform

Roof - Review: The visually handicapped relies particularly on sounds and smells to move about a city. On a rooftop, will you see the city through new eyes after a blind musician shares his life and experiences? Will you remember it from his point of view?

Hotel - Hotel Maids: Who are these people who go into your room when you're not there? This is an installation composed of biographies. You will discover portraits of the cleaning staff: films, original voice recordings and photographs that shed light on Festival contributions were well the 'invisible' beings who clean up after others.

Factory - La Fabrica: Repetition and routine relaxes you, and makes you feel safe. Production line workers repeat the same movements day after day, but their thoughts and ideas change: they dream with open eyes. This performance gives you insight into a factory, where the forces of mundaneness and innovation are openly confronted.

and working situations of truck drivers. This was achieved by bundling 40 audience members inside a converted truck with Singapore drivers detailing their everyday lives, while trundling through backstreets and port areas.

Last year's highlight, Radio Muezzin, was a refreshing take on the Islam call to prayer, the Adhan, through words and images of four muezzins (men appointed to make the call to pray at mosques).

Hotel: Argentinian Lola Arias is a writer, director, actress and songwriter. Her productions play with the overlap zone between reality and fiction. Her work Mi vida después / My life after, featuring six performers who reconstruct their parents' youth in 1970s Argentina, toured for three years in 18 international festivals in Europe and America. She most recently staged Familienbande at Kammerspiele, Munich and That Enemy Within at HAU, Berlin.



Her plays, poems and short stories have been translated into German, English and French, as well as published in different countries.

Factory: Gerardo Naumann is an innovator in theatre and film. His first breakthrough came with Cosas which premiered at the Festival del Rojas 5. His internationally-lauded production Emily was written with text from language textbooks and manuals, and staged at a kitchen furniture shop in the outskirts of Buenos Aires. In his last production A useful play, he asked himself if theatre could somehow be useful.

In Singapore, Ciudades Paralelas (Parallel Cities) is a collaborative effort with local artists: Lee Chee Keng, the Singapore Drama Educators Association (Hotel); Koh Hui Ling, Drama Box (Factory); and Elvira Holmberg, the Singapore Drama Educators Association (Roof)

Ciudades Paralelas (Parallel Cities) is a portable festival invented and curated by Lola Arias and Stefan Kaegi (www.ciudadesparalelas. com). The original eight projects are co-produced by HAU Berlin and Schauspielhaus Zürich, in collaboration with the Goethe-Institut Warschau, the Teatr Nowy and its foundation, and commissioned by the Kulturstiftung des Bundes, the Swiss cultural foundation Pro Helvetia and the Goethe-Institut Buenos Aires.

and started his journey back in time to Mandor, the ancient capital of the Lan Fang Republic. There,

Singapore, you think. No, but the Lan Fang Republic certainly has similarities in geographical size, type of government rule and diligent citizens.

The Lan Fang Republic began in 1777 with Luo Fang Bo. Luo was a Hakka Chinese who united his group of hardworking gold miner comrades in West Borneo to establish the Lan Fang Republic. Democracy was the way to go, he decided.

The Republic thrived for 107 years, under the rule of 10 presidents, until the Dutch marched along and disintegrated it in 1884. It all sounds simple enough, but is it really?

Artist Choy Ka Fai delved further, and started his journey back in time to Mandor, the ancient capital of the Lan Fang Republic. There, a temple paying tribute to Luo, his tomb and an exhausted goldmine greeted him.

A trip to Mei Xian, China, Luo's birthplace, uncovered a memorial hall honouring Luo and Luo's last descendent.

In the Lan Fang Chronicles¹ 2012, Choy presents a perspective of the Republic's existence through an installation performance surrounding a series of speculative artifacts, archival materials and audio-visual works.





Murakami's experimental style and compelling characters have gained him prominence in the Japanese literary scene and as a world writer. Classic themes of his stories focus on love and loneliness, realism, alternative worlds and enigmatic characters who are deeply emotional under a seemingly impassive front.

In The Wind-Up Bird Chronicle, these leitmotifs are not absent.

Unemployed, aimless Toru Okada loses first his cat and then his wife, Kumiko. Toru's struggle to cope with their mysterious disappearances catalyses a warped adventure David Lynch would be proud to call his own. with a phone-sex caller, a bossy prostitute, a death-obsessed teen. an old soldier who shares wartime atrocities, a sadistic politician, a dry well and a dark hotel room.

Such alluring undertones of 3D reality versus surrealism, past versus present and earthliness versus etherealism - it is clear why American filmmaker Stephen Earnhart was transfixed by the idea of transforming The Wind-Up Bird Chronicle into a multimedia production, complete with bunraku-style (a form of traditional Japanese puppet theatre) puppetry, shadowplay, film and live GO FOR THE WIND-UP BIRD CHRONICLE ...

Earnhart's extraordinary team of designers, led by puppet director and set designer Tom Lee, co-writer Greg Pierce and cast collaborated with him during a highly-intensive and lengthy development process. Together, through multiple workshops and presentations, they arrived at the finished piece presented here in Singapore.

After travelling to Japan in 2004 to meet Murakami-san and secure the adaptation rights, Earnhart spent 11 months in Japan writing and shooting materials for the play, while fostering relationships with colleagues in the Tokyo theatre world.



Take a volunteer orchestra, a spirited composer and an indie film director. Throw them together with a seminal 20th-century classical composition and you get the Rite(s) of Spring.

The Rite of Spring is a ballet revolving round a pre-Chistian Russian pagan ritual in which a young girl is sacrificed, dancing herself to death to gain the favour of the Spring God.

When the ballet premiered in 1913 at the Paris Théâtre des Champs-Élysées, the audience was horrified by its intensely rhythmic score and primitive choreography. Equally admirable is composer Ho It was, after all, an audience that was comfortable with the refined conventions of classical ballet.

Igor Stravinsky's music in the Rite of Spring is harmonically adventurous, with a prominent use of dissonance for colour and energy. Rhythmically, it is similarly exciting, with irregular, constantly changing time signatures and off-beat accents, resulting in the dancers having to count out their dance steps by the numbers like a mathematics lesson.

Today, the complex piece still gives even the most accomplished musician spasms of apprehension. But the young Orchestra of the Music Makers (OMM) takes on the challenge of reproducing this pulse with raw energy and effervescent can-do attitude.

Will the young 'uns pull it off?

Chee Kong's original 15-minute piece preceding the Rite of Spring. which features international cellist star Qin Li-Wei in a solo.

The third and final element in the Rite(s) of Spring is filmmaker Royston Tan's endeavour to interpret classical music. Known for his indie films and more recently, commercial big-screen successes, he has never ventured anywhere near classical music which makes his involvement in this work all the more beguiling.

The OMM came into existence four years ago, when a group of graduates from several of Singapore's local high schools with advanced music programmes asked prominent Singapore conductor Chan Tze Law to help them form an orchestra and be their mentor.

Ho Chee Kong is the head of Composition Studies at the Yong Siew Toh Conservatory of Music. He has received international and local grants, awards and commissions for works that have enjoyed performances in Asia, Europe and the United States.

Royston Tan is a local filmmaker, director and scriptwriter whose work has reaped international awards. He first caught the public



attention through his short films:

(2001), 48 on AIDS (2002), Mother (2002) and 15 (2002). He has also directed four features: 15: The Movie (2003), 4:30 (2006), 881 (2007) and 12 Lotus (2008).



In recent years, Itoh has focused his energies on creative performances in non-conventional theatres, often choosing to work closely with non-performers in the community. One of these projects is the Oyaji Café.

'Self:Harm' – increasingly, performances by youths have elements of self-harm. While it isn't wrong to include scenes like these, how do actors and directors stay true to the story, yet not play scenes to suggest that self-harm is attractive? Join youth group Theatre:Connect in this performance led discussion as areas such as research, rehearsal process as well as performance affects the audience. Panelists include actors, a director, psychologists and teachers.

WATCH INSPIRING PERFORMANCES BY THESE GROUPS:

'When I'm Sixty Four' - a collaboration between youths from Theatre Cell and Ageless Theatre, a community theatre collective for seniors. Seniors re-tell their stories to preserve and pass them on for future generations. The production aims to capture, document and propagate social and cultural identities through the medium of theatre.

Other works in progress include a performance by teachers and how stress affects them and a movement piece by the Down Syndrome Association.




